(SAULT STE. MARIE, ON) – The Sault Ste. Marie Science Festival, presented by GFL Environmental, is back for another year of science, technology, and fun in various locations across the city April 25 to April 29. Every year the Sault Ste. Marie Science Festival shines the spotlight on science among children, teens, and adults by offering an opportunity to celebrate science in an engaging, interactive, and welcoming setting for all ages.
