## Science North launches *Jane Goodall – Reasons for Hope* film and exhibition in Thunder Bay

(Thunder Bay, ON) – Visitors to the Thunder Bay Museum can now see an exclusive 25-minute version of the uplifting film, Jane Goodall – Reasons for Hope as part of a new exhibition designed by Science North. To complement the film, interactive activities will also be included that focus on biodiversity and the environment. Together, the exhibition will highlight Dr. Jane Goodall's four pillars of hope: the resilience of nature, the power of youth, the indomitable human spirit, and the amazing human intellect. The exhibition will be on display at the Thunder Bay Museum indefinitely and is included in general admission. For more information about the museum, visit thunderbaymuseum.com.

To help celebrate the opening, The Honourable Patty Hajdu, MP Marcus Powlowski, MPP Kevin Holland and Thunder Bay Mayor Kevin Boshcoff were in attendance and were able to experience the exhibition alongside visitors to the museum this morning.

Permanent visitor experiences featuring the exclusive 25-minute film will open at four other partner attractions in Northern Ontario over the coming months; including the Kenora Lake of the Woods Discovery Centre, Cochrane Public Library, Sault Ste. Marie Canadian Bushplane Heritage Centre, and North Bay Museum.

Jane Goodall - Reasons for Hope is Science North's 7th giant screen film and was produced and directed by David Lickley in association with the Jane Goodall Institute and distributor Cosmic Picture. The film highlights Dr. Goodall's decades of work and inspires viewers to make a difference in the world. Audiences will see inspirational stories such as: the migration of the Northern Bald Ibis over the Alps, the re-introduction of the American Bison to the Blackfeet Nation in Montana, the globally recognized Sudbury Regreening Story, and technology advances in Arizona to combat climate change.
