Science North celebrates Indigenous Ingenuity and the launch of the Thunder Bay Science Festival

(THUNDER BAY, ON) – Over the coming days and weeks, Thunder Bay will play host to two unique events celebrating scientific innovation. Earlier today at the Thunder Bay Museum, special guests celebrated the grand opening of Anishinaabewin Maamninendimowin: Pane Gii-Bite (*Indigenous Ingenuity: Timeless Inventions*) and the launch of the Thunder Bay Science Festival. Chief Michele Solomon of Fort William First Nation opened the event with a traditional welcome.

Indigenous Ingenuity, presented by Indigenous Tourism Ontario and Science North, is currently on display in the Thunder Bay Museum until March 17th. Admission is by donation, and visitors can experience the exhibition from 1:00pm to 5:00pm Tuesday through Sunday (closed Monday), with the last entry at 4:00pm.

Thunder Bay is the 14th stop of the tour. Until fall of 2024, the exhibition will be travelling to approximately 30 communities across Northern Ontario, presenting a clever and novel mix of science and culture intended to stir a sense of pride among First Nation, Inuit and Métis communities.

The Thunder Bay Science Festival returns for its 12th annual celebration of science and technology from February 18 to 24, 2024. This year, the festival promises a week-long program of engaging events, exhibits, and activities that are open to the public and free of charge. People of all ages will be able to explore the wonders of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) in the world around them.

This year, the Festival lineup includes the Science of Sound featuring the Tamarack Wind Quintet; Science at Snowday on the Waterfont; and Nerd Night at the Sleeping Giant Brewery. The week wraps up with the Science Carnival on Saturday, February 24 from 10am to 3pm at Intercity Shopping Centre. This inspiring one-day community event highlights the exciting science happening in the Thunder Bay region and provides families with the opportunity to participate in engaging and fun science, innovation, and technology activities. The Carnival will feature local exhibitors displaying hands-on presentations and activities for all ages.
