



## SCIENCE NORTH'S GREAT NORTHERN ONTARIO ROADSHOW WINS A NATIONAL 2022 AWARD

SUDBURY, ON – On October 13, at the Canadian Association of Science Centres' (CASC) CASCADE Awards Ceremony, Science North was recognized in the Institutional category for the Great Northern Ontario Roadshow project. The CASCADE awards are hosted annually and highlight the many ways in which Canada's science centres and museums represent the diversity of the Canadian population within its workforce and its audiences.
